Job Purpose

Your key responsibility will be for the joint delivery of the demonstration of Technical Television Journalism skills to undergraduate and postgraduate students. This is likely to incorporate the demonstration of TV editing, filming and sound skills as well as online and documentary. Ideally you will have an understanding of newsroom and studio workflows and of converged news environments. You will be expected to support the Department and the relevant Programme Teams in terms of curriculum development, student recruitment, income generation, as well as research/consultancy activities.

Main Responsibilities

Students and Learning

- Support the planning and delivery of teaching of units in accordance with defined curricula and under the quidance of unit and programme tutors;
- Provide guidance to and supervise students' activities, including practical work to support learning;
- Monitor student performance, support delivery of units and provide effective feedback to lecturers and quidance to students;
- Actively participate in the development of productive links with media organisations at a local, regional and national level.

Research and Enterprise

- Assist as a team member in research projects that contribute towards the Faculty's agreed objectives.
- Support the development and delivery of enterprise activities as required.

Other

- Assist as required with Faculty marketing and administrative activities.
- Maintain own personal and professional development in line with agreed personal development plan within the appraisal process.
